- Retains your planned profit margin








What is Project Management?

7 Most Common Reasons Projects Fail

- 1. Unrealistic/incorrect client expectations
- 2. Inadequate estimating
- 3. Poorly defined business requirements
- 4. Not getting paid for all you do
- 5. Scope creep
- 6. Content bottlenecks
- 7. No risk mitigation plan





Project Management BENEFIT

- Set client expectations more effectively
- Projects become more predictable
- Retain planned ROI
- Stay within budget
- Get done on time
- Avoid scope creep
- Resolve roadblocks and issues more quickly and easier

The Content-Collection Bottleneck

- Establish a Content-First Approach
- Make it easy (streamline processes)
- Create incentives and penalties
- Be brutally honest Educate them
- Estimate content
- Create reminders
- Use Wireframes

What is Scope Creep?

When your project slowly moves into work activities and related costs that weren't previously agreed upon.







How to Control Scope Creep

- 1. Establish a good change control procedure
- 2. Use a change budget
- 3. Invoke the change control procedure without exception








Why Not Just Pad the Estimate?

- Change Control Results
 - 1. Get paid for all you do
 - 2. Stop frivolous changes
 - 3. Better estimates







- Content Collection Results
 - 1. Finish on time
 - 2. Less re-work





- Acceptance Management Results
 - 1. Fewer revision cycles
 - 2. Makes final approval easier and faster


